Discussion Questions:

1. How big are your prayers? God's set himself the audacious goal of settling for nothing less than the complete restoration of the universe and making sure that you're absolutely suited to live in it.
 - a. Can you remember a time when you longed to see his goals happen more—a time when that longing drove you to pray for it?
 - b. Where do you want to see his kingdom come more fully in your own life and lifetime, for the glory of his name?
2. God cares about his reputation—that he's known for keeping his word even when he makes big promises (Numbers 14:11-16, Ezekiel 36:22-23).
 - a. How does God's concern for his name give you confidence to pray?
 - b. What does his concern move you to pray for (i.e. which of his promises do you want to pray for now)?
3. Where have you been relying on God's Spirit living in you to give you super-abundant life so that you can live in his kingdom now, before Christ returns?
 - a. Are there areas where you forget to ask, seek and knock—areas where you try to live without actively relying on his Spirit?
 - b. What kind of nourishment do you need from his Spirit in those areas?
 - c. Spend some time with a couple brothers and sisters, asking God to feed you and to feed them.
